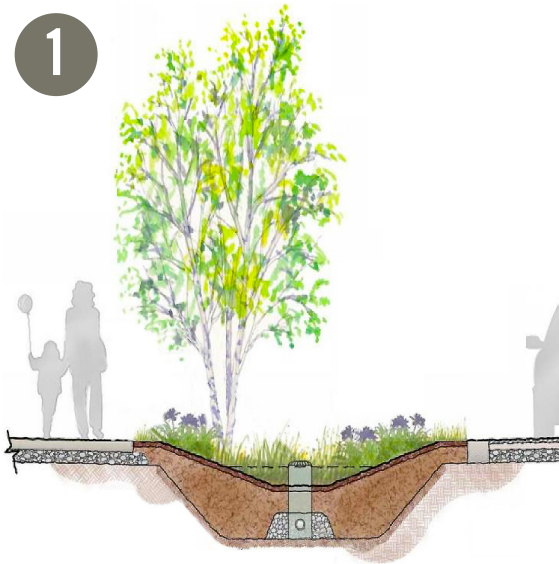


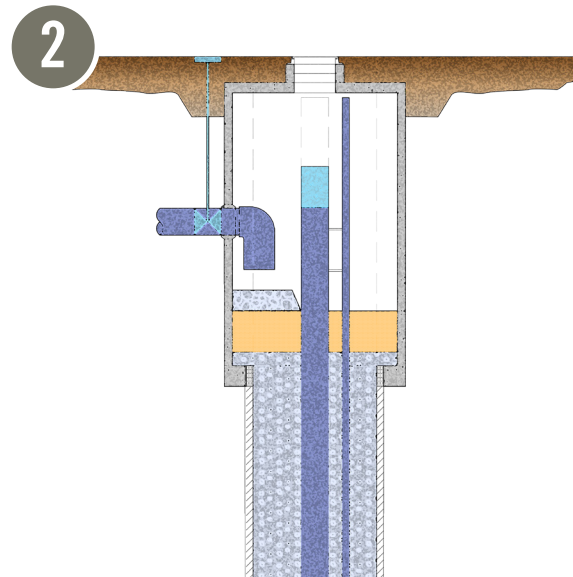
Stormwater System 101

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RAIN GARDEN (BIORETENTION)

Rain Gardens are used to treat stormwater from the project site. Pollution generating runoff is routed to these facilities and treated per Department of Ecology standards.



STORMWATER WELL

Stormwater wells are used to manage stormwater flow rates leaving the site. Stormwater is routed to these facilities and infiltrated into the ground per Department of Ecology standards.



WETLAND

Wetlands within the project site were maintained and protected. The proposed stormwater system was designed to mimic existing flows to the wetlands.

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Stormwater regulations have been evolving and becoming more stringent over the past few years. The purpose of these regulations is to help protect water quality, prevent adverse impacts from flooding and control stormwater runoff to levels equivalent to those that occurred prior to development. Rain Gardens and Stormwater wells are code authorized facilities that help achieve these goals in a low impact, green manner.
